San Jose honours "Nanking" author Iris Chang

SAN JOSE Feb. 26, 2015

San Jose City Council unanimously approved the creation of an "Iris Chang Memorial Park". The 5-acre park will be set up in North San Jose River Oaks Parkway near where Iris Chang, author of *The Rape of Nanking*, lived during most of her life. In addition to green open space, the park will also offer two tennis courts, a half basketball court and children's playground.

Iris Chang's father Shau-Jin Chang and mother Ying-Ying Chang voiced that their daughter fought for recognition and justice for the many victims of the Asian Holocaust during World War II.

Three years ago Dr. Chang wrote a memoir of her daughter . . .


Memories of the Massacre, Nanjing 1937
